Monroe County Civic Theater is proud to present Euripides' *The Trojan Women* as adapted by Jean-Paul Sartre.

The Trojan Women follows the fates of the women of Troy after their city has been sacked, their husbands killed, and as their remaining families are about to be taken away as slaves, focusing on their queen Hecuba, her daughter Cassandra, her daughter-in-law Andromache, and the infamous Helen of Troy. The play's antiwar message and examination of personal responsibility, misogyny, female agency and the cruel aftermath of war resonate as strongly today as they did over 2000 years ago. This richness of theme and text is enhanced by the existentialist, condemnation of European colonialism brought to the work by Sartre's adapatation.

Incorporating a less traditional "theater in the round" staging and live music with a total of eight original or adapted music pieces incorporating the text and inspired by the music of the Ancient World, this has been a very challenging & rewarding production.
